By order dated September 7, 2004, the Judicial Council enjoined the complainant from filing further repetitive and frivolous complaints of judicial misconduct against judges of this Circuit. Over the course of 8 years complainant had filed more than 18 misconduct complaints against both district and circuit judges, which were all dismissed as meritless or frivolous, and which the Council denied review. The complaints all stemmed from complainant's civil litigation. The Judicial Council determined that complainant was abusing the complaint process. The injunction order stated that the Clerk shall "review any further submissions received from this complainant, and return any that the Clerk deems to fall within the scope of this injunction. The Clerk may refer to the Chief Judge any submission, about which there is doubt whether the injunction applies."

On January 28, 2019, the Circuit received a letter from complainant in which he requested that the injunction be lifted so that he could file additional judicial misconduct complaints. The allegations complainant raised have been considered in multiple judicial misconduct complaints as well as in the underlying litigation. The complainant has not demonstrated that the allegations he seeks to raise fall outside of the injunction or warrant further review. Upon consideration thereof, it is

ORDERED, by the Judicial Council, that the request to lift the injunction be denied.
