AMENDED ORDER

Upon consideration of appellees' notice of status report, the response thereto, and the second corrected reply, it is

ORDERED that the court's order filed May 22, 2020, be amended to reflect that the date and time that the Clerk is directed to issue the mandate is now June 12, 2020, at 5:00 p.m. See Fed. R. App. P. 41(b). This court's May 22 order was clear: it stayed issuance of the mandate until June 8, 2020, and it did not state that the mandate was stayed "pending the filing of a petition for a writ of certiorari." Fed. R. App. P. 41(d)(1); see also, e.g., Doe v. FEC, No. 18-5099, 2019 WL 3955706 (D.C. Cir. July 24, 2019) (granting motion to stay mandate pursuant to Fed. R. App. P. 41(d)(2)(B)(ii) and D.C. Cir. Rule 41(a)(2)). We expressly deny appellees' motion to stay the mandate pending disposition of their petition for a writ of certiorari. The Supreme Court directed this court to proceed "with appropriate dispatch," which we have done. Barr v. Roane, 140 S. Ct. 353 (2019).
